- Insecticide resistance & coordinated management
- Implications to virus diseases and emergence of new (begomoviruses, closteroviruses; others?)-
- Virus-vector relationships- predictive? What is potential?
- Education and outreach- how and what
- Management tools- within and cross commodity
- Interstate movement of infested plants
- Additional introductions at ports of entry- Monitoring?
- Additional biotypes on the horizon?-Long term monitoring
